Canine Companions enhances the lives of children, adults, and veterans with disabilities by providing highly-trained service dogs at no charge to the recipient and provides life-time support for the life of the dog and any successor dogs. Since 1975, over 8,300 service dogs have been provided to people with disabilities.



Friday Night Out was founded by AWC members to create a community for people with special needs. Monthly gatherings provide a safe place where inclusion and acceptance prevail, and young people can socialize and build life-long relationships.

George Mark Children's House focuses on quality of life and continuity of care for children with illnesses that modern healthcare cannot yet cure, or for those who have chronic medical conditions. Critical, compassionate support is provided for the entire family.



Monument Crisis Center is a community-based non-profit family resource center located in Concord. They offer nutritious food, quality resources, and referrals to low-income individuals and families in order to help them become stable and secure in our community.



Penny Pines plays a vital role in renewing national forests in California by using contributions for preparing sites for new trees and/or planting seedlings. AWC has contributed to this reforestation project since 1961.



Since 1965, Youth Homes has provided services for underserved youth and young adults who have experienced traumas, abuse, and neglect. Annually, they serve over 150 youth and their families to create positive, sustainable change.



Through our fundraising efforts, AWC has awarded needs-based, college scholarships continuously since 1939. Our Community Outreach activities support our community through "done in a day" volunteer work.
